Women on the Water: Sailing superstition!

Nowhere are there more conflicting maritime superstitions than with the subject of women on board. Women weren't welcomed aboard ship, except in port when the sailors had been at sea for a long time. Sometimes passion couldn't wait for landing, and affairs were consummated on the gun deck. That's supposedly where the term "son of a gun" originated. A more practical reason for the ban on women is that they would arouse passions and jealousy. In today's U.S. Navy, women serve on every type of ship except submarines.

Strange sounds heard at sea were often blamed on sirens, or mermaids, mythical half-women, half-fish who sang enchanted songs. The melodies supposedly lured sailors into treacherous waters where their ships would be dashed against the rocks.

Ironically, the siren's song could wreck a ship, but tradition has it that the sight of a bare-breasted woman could calm an angry sea. That's why so many figureheads of sailing ships were bare breasted, well-endowed women. Women became the prevalent figurehead during the 19th century. Before then it might be the owner of the ship, a war hero, or an imposing animal like a lion, especially for warships. The ancient Egyptians painted eyes on the bow to help the ship find its way. According to Sorkin, figureheads evolved from that practice.

Ships are always referred to as "she." The reason is that they are the sailor's home and refuge, sheltering and protecting him from an angry ocean. Just like mom and mother earth.

From the desk of PIP 2014 Chairman-Sharon Klupar

The Chicago ParrotHead Club takes pride in selecting and supporting specific charities. We strive to make informed choices that will ensure all of our hard work raising money for donations will benefit these charities. Recently there has been some concern that the American Cancer Society may not be the best choice for our donation. This organization has slipped in their star rating to 2 stars out of 4 according to the watch dog group, Charity Navigator. 77 cents or less raised in donations actually goes to the program. Their CEO was paid \$628,374 last year. The American Cancer Society has been one of two charities that were supported with donations from our club from money raised at Party In Parrot-Dise(PIP). After some research, the PIP committee has decided to drop the American Cancer Society and replace it with The Gateway for Cancer Research. Here is some highlighted information on this organization:

Headquartered at 1336 Basswod Rd. Schaumburg IL, The Gateway is a unique 501(c) (3) non-profit cancer charity. Thanks to generous underwriting, **99.6 cents of every dollar they receive funds cancer research**- so no walks, no marketing costs, no admin or legal costs, no salaries- just cancer research. They are underwritten by the Cancer Treatment Centers of America (CTCA). **However**, The Gateway **does not** fund any research at CTCA. The Gateway funds Phase I and Phase II human cancer clinical trials all over the United States. The results of Phase I and II clinical trials **do not** benefit CTCA. CTCA has **no legal** authority over the Gateway. The Gateway funds cancer clinical trials that meet the criterion that is deemed acceptable by their board of scientific counselors. CTCA has **no say** over what they fund and **no one** from CTCA is on their board of scientific counselors.

The Gateway currently is funding 26 active clinical trials in 17 different types of cancer. Four of their active clinical trials that are yielding extremely promising results are:

At UCLA- in lung cancer

At Rush Chicago - in brain cancer

At Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center in Seattle, WA-colon cancer

At Washington U Medical Center- in breast cancer

The Gateway for Cancer Research seeks out medical researchers devoted to finding breakthroughs in all areas of cancer research for all types of cancer. In 2012 the Gateway funded studies focused on sarcoma, leukemia, brain, colorectal, lung, blood, cervical, prostrate, breast and skin cancer.

They are not rated by watchdog organizations like BBB Wise Giving Alliance or Charity Navigator because they do not fit the typical categories these organizations look for mainly because they don't have expenses. The 0.4 cents is to cover banking fees. With nearly 20 years of experience, The Gateway offers stability and a strong reputation among the non-profit community. They have ongoing partnerships with numerous organizations such as: Choose Hope, Cancer Sucks, Cancer Fighters Thrive, MedOP, and Cancer Treatment Centers of America.

I hope you all are excited about this charity and look forward to raising money for The Gateway for Cancer Research and the Alzheimer's Association at the upcoming Party In Parrot-Dise event April, 2014.
