Captain's Logbook

Thirty-seventh Entry: December 21, 2011

I am always happy to know that when we can't be on some faraway beach, we have a place here in Chicago to enjoy that common thread that brings us together. I would like to close with a story (sorry Julie.....hope you have room!). I usually have something quirky or a quote, and I considered the story of the Christmas Tree Boat, which sunk in Lake Michigan outside Twin Rivers, WI. long ago. But with so many families, including my own, affected by these wars, I thought this one would be appropriate..... the World War I Christmas Miracle.

During World War I, in the winter of 1914, on the battlefields of Flanders, on of the most unusual events in all of human history took place. The Germans had been in a fierce battle



with the British and French. Both sides were dug in, safe in muddy, man-made trenches six to eight feet deep that seemed to stretch forever.

...."I was gazing toward the German lines and thinking what a different sort of Christmas Eve this was from any I had experienced in the past when suddenly lights began to appear along the top of the German trenches - these were Christmas trees which were adorned with lighted candles burning steadily in the still, frosty air! Other guards had, of course, seen the same thing, and quickly awoke those asleep in the shelters, to 'come and see this thing which had come to pass.' Then suddenly our opponents began to sing 'Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht' (Silent Night). They finished their carol and we thought that we ought to retaliate in the same way, so we sang 'The First Nowell,' and when we finished they all began clapping. And so it went on. First the Germans would sing one of their carols and then we would sing one of ours, until we started up with 'O Come All Ye Faithful' and the Germans immediately joined in singing the same hymn to the Latin words 'Adeste Fideles.' And I thought, well, this was really a most extraordinary thing our nations both singing the same carol in the middle of a war."

Incredibly, many of the Germans, who had worked in England before the war, were able to speak good enough English to propose a "Christmas Truce." The British and French troops, all along the miles of trenches, accepted. In a few places, Allied troops fired at the Germans as they crawled out of their trenches. But the Germans were persistent and Christmas would be celebrated even under the threat of impending death.

Signboards arose up and down the trenches in a variety of shapes. They were usually in English, or – from the Germans- in fractured English. Rightly, the Germans assumed that the other side could not read traditional gothic lettering, and that few English understood spoken German.

and waited for a response. More placards on both sides popped up.

A spontaneous truce resulted. Soldiers left their trenches, meeting in the middle to shake hands. The first order of business was to bury the dead who had previously been unreachable because of the conflict. Then, they exchanged gifts, chocolate cake, cognac, postcards, newspapers, tobacco. In a few places, along the trenches, soldiers exchanged rifles for soccer balls and began to play games

It didn't last forever. In fact some of the generals didn't like it at all and commanded their troops to resume shooting at each other. After all, they were in a war. Soldiers eventually did resume shooting at each other. But only after, in a number of cases, a few days of wasting rounds of ammunition shooting at stars in the sky instead of soldiers in the opposing army across the field.

For a few precious moments there was peace on Earth and good will toward men. All because the focus was on Christmas. Happens every time. There is something about Christmas that changes people. A celebration of the human spirit, the Christmas Truce remains a moving manifestation of the absurdities of war. A very minor Scottish poet of Great War vintage, Frederick Niven, may have got it right in his "A Carol from Flanders," which closed,

O ye who read this truthful rhyme From Flanders kneel and say; God speed the time when every day Shall be as Christmas Day.

Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah and a great New Year to all.


