# **Apple Pie Shots**

## Ingredients:


- 1 qt. Everclear [ or Golden Grain or 180 Proof Vodka] amount is approx. ~90% of a 5th
- 1 gal. Apple Juice
- 1 gal. Cider, apple
- 6 -8 sticks Cinnamon Sticks
- 1 cup white sugar, 2 cups brown sugar (or any mixture thereof)

## Mixing Instructions:

Mix apple juice, apple cider, sugar, and cinnamon sticks together and bring to boil - simmer until cinnamon sticks unroll (~2hrs). Remove from heat. Once cool, add Everclear and taste. Refrigerate. Add more Everclear if you want it stronger, more sugar if you want it sweeter.




