The Alzheimer's Association Memory Walk® is the nation's largest event to raise awareness and funds for Alzheimer care, support and research – and it calls on volunteers of all ages to become champions in the fight against this fatal disease. Since 1989,

Memory Walk has raised more than \$260 million nationally for the cause

Memory Walk is a community event that joins friends, family and coworkers as they walk to end Alzheimer's. Participants typically register in teams of 10-12 and fundraise using tools supported by the Alzheimer's Association. The Walk this year is Sunday, September, 13th.

The Chicago Memory Walk is a non-competitive 5k walk around the lakefront that both starts and finishes at Montrose Avenue and the lake. Dogs on leashes are welcome, and the entire route is wheelchair and stroller friendly. For those of you who are competitive, The Pirate Hood will challenge you to a 5k race. If you can beat him (and he should finish in less than 25 minutes), he will donate \$25 in your name to Memory Walk. Of course you have to do it on foot, not segway, car, bike etc.

of the good we do each month by collecting things at our monthly meetings:

We collect Pop and Beer-tops for Ronald McDonald House. Why tab tops? They are easily removed from the can and allow for any individual or community group to participate. Tabs are much smaller and cleaner than cans, enabling the House to handle the large volume that it receives. Besides, the Tab Top Program is unique to the Ronald McDonald House. Once the tab tops are at the Ronald McDonald House they are put into large French fry boxes and ready for the McDonald's supplier truck to pick them up and take to Minnesota where they are sold to a scrap metal company.

We collect Toiletries for Battered Women because they often have to flee with little or no notice not giving them the opportunity to gather personal belongings. Being able to wash, bathe and even brush teeth daily can significantly improve one's selfesteem.

And we also collect old cell phones to donate to Call To Protect. All donated phones are sent to ReCellular, Inc. where they are either refurbished and sold, or recycled. One hundred percent of the net proceeds generated by the sale of the refurbished phones are used to make grants to national organizations working to end family violence.

All phones donated that are obsolete or

damaged are recycled according to strict environmental standards.
