

PAGCAGOULA RUN 9 GEALGG EN 5 HAYG?

Sounds crazy, but true!! We had to keep counting on our fingers. We needed to get away, and as Spring Break loomed near, the concept of running down to New Orleans crossed our minds and we never looked back. Billy got off work at 8:00 on a Saturday morning, we loaded up the car and hit the road South. After a quick 7 and a half hours, we rolled into Memphis in daylight. With Priceline working its' magic for hotels, we stayed in 5 and 6 star hotels the whole trip for less than \$79 every night! So in Memphis.....a quick trolley ride in an old wooden manually operated car for \$1, and we were quickly on Beale Street. Statues of Elvis and the smell of BBQ and delat blues filling the air. There are always the popular places, Coyote Ugly, BB Kings, etc.....but after we ate some great Southern cooking, we settled on a small dive bar and sat ourselves in the window to listen to the live blues band and watch the people walk by. By the way.....they close Beale Street like it is a festival so everyone can just walk around and enjoy the sites and sounds!

OK....next day, continue south and after 6 and a half hours we are in New Orleans! Nothing like staying in a beautiful hotel on Canal overlooking the French Quarter, and we were barely in the door before we ran back downstairs and headed into the streets. We wandered down Bourbon Street once, but we have been there, and not up for the touristy thing. But starving, we hit O'Briens for a quick bite, and although known for their Hurricanes, their Bloody Mary's are simply the best!!!! A little too cold to sit in the wide open courtyard, but the feel was there. After that, we popped across the street to The Boondock Saint. And yes, they have the movie looped on a TV and play all manner of Irish music from traditional to punk. There we talked to several locals and realized we are truly in the South with a story that is best not put on paper. But they directed us to where the locals go, where to eat, and where to go see the big old houses, including where Sandra Bullock lives. A few more stops included voodoo shops (Kristin was on a mission to curse her boss!), Marie Laveau's bar, with (I am not kidding) what appears to be a petrified cat above the bar in a glass case! The Brew House (OMG....the seafood cheesecake and roast duck with cornbread stuffing is outstanding), Cafe Du Monde for beignets and that signature coffee with chickory, and our personal favorite the French market with grilled oysters in the half shell and 2 pound mounds of crawfish! One last stop in New Orleans, and a not to miss is the Blacksmith Shop on Bourbon, but way at the end away from the hustle and bustle. It is actually the oldest bar in the United States, check it out!

Of note while down there is that you can run out a couple hours, which we did, to the Tabasco factory, and for \$1 you get on Avery Island and can get a tour and get samples and food and souvenirs. It was cool. being the first salt mine, which still operates under the island, Tabasco sits in oak casks for 3 years we found out, and they have so many awesome flavors now, including jalapeno and Sweet and Sour ice cream!!! Sounds weird but it was delicious!

OK.....so by now, you have figured out we are on a food and drink trip, which we were, which leads to the Pascagoula Run, as we named it. BECAUSE.....we headed out of New Orleans heading East and ran the coastline through Mississippi to Alabama, drove through Biloxi and also Pascagoula, and saw the beginning stages of the Margaritaville Hotel and Casino, and made our final southern stop at where else? The FLORABAMA! Ok, I know you may get excited since Jimmy has a passion for this place... but the original was destroyed in a hurricane, and the new one is coming together, but really.....it is truly a dive that people stopped in, grabbed food and a drink, and left. LOL The staff seemed bored or at best irritated to have to work. The ocean looked great though and the warm breeze was awesome! So we checked that off our list and headed North to Nashville. This was a long day and we just needed food and a bed before heading home the next day to make the Club meeting!

All in all, we figured we drove I-55 and I-65 start to finish, and passed through Illinois, Missouri, Tennessee, Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, and Indiana. Not bad for 5 days, and the stories we could tell, but just not enough room in the Korner, but do ask......our little Pascagoula Run was a blast!
