Our club camp out is scheduled for Friday-Sunday, July 23-25. Pearl Lake Campground

located at 1220 Dearborn in South Beloit, IL which is at I-90 and the Wisconsin border, but on the Illinois side. Just for reference, distance from the Elmhurst Public House is 82 miles.

Camping fee is \$45 per night. One camping unit (tent or camper) is permitted per site, with up to 4 adults. Water and electricity are included. Camping fee includes beach passes - for each night of camping, per registered camper. So anyone camping Friday and Saturday night will have beach access for Saturday and Sunday. The campground is very clean, well run and orderly. The bath house facilities were rebuilt about two years ago and are kept spotlessly clean. All campers must be registered by 10:00 PM, and they do enforce quiet time after that. We have tentatively reserved 8 sites together and will have to give them final numbers when it gets closer.

Now ABOUT THE BEACH! This is the big draw here! The lake is an old quarry with an all-sand bottom, so the water is crystal clear. In fact, part of the lake serves as a scuba diving facility - Check out the beach pictures on the website!

The beach is open from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM daily. On the weekends the beach bar opens at noon and there is a DJ until 3:00 PM. If anyone wants to come out to the beach for the day without camping, the beach fee is \$10 per person, with children under 5 free. There is a spacious sandy beach surrounding the swimming area, and a compressor is available for filling those inflatable rafts. (Rafts with cupholders are highly recommended here, as floating with a boat drink while listening to those island tunes is a wonderful thing!) There is a snack bar on the patio that sells burgers, nachoes, ice cream, soft drinks etc. during beach hours. There is also a full service restaurant on site. Alcohol can be brought into the campground, but only drinks purchased from the bar are allowed on the beach. They are reasonably priced and a wide selection is available.

If anyone has questions or needs further information, please call or email me. We have been seasonal campers at Pearl Lake for the past 8 years and it is definitely our One Particular Harbor in this latitude.

Good Samaritan Hospital nurse (and Chicago Parrothead member) honored by Chicago Cubs, throws first pitch ...

The Chicago Cubs honored nurses at their game Wednesday, May 12 - Florence Nightingale's birthday and the last day of National Nurses Week. A special honoree, Advocate Good Samaritan Hospital nurse Peggy Farrell, was asked to throw out the ceremonial first pitch of the game. Making a perfect pitch to the home plate to Cubs pitcher James Russell (40), Farrell showed nurses can do anything. "I did what I came out to do and that's what nurses do every day - we get the job done," Farrell said. Farrell, manager of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and Pediatrics at Good Samaritan Hospital, was chosen by the editors of Nursing Spectrum in an essay contest sponsored in conjunction with Chamberlain College of Nursing. Farrell wrote about her experience with the first abandoned baby at the hospital under new Safe Haven laws. On her own time, Farrell forged a relationship with the mother - a high school girl, who contacted the hospital days after the delivery. Offering support and postpartum resources, Farrell also arranged for the girl to meet the adoptive parents.

Three years later, Farrell is still in contact with the girl, who is studying to be a lawyer at a prestigious law school.

A lifelong Cubs fan, Farrell said the experience was a once in a lifetime honor.

"The story moves me to this day," Farrell said. Jennifer Thew, Nursing Spectrum national editor, said it was Farrell's nonjudging actions that make this an amazing story worthy of accolades. "You could have said it was so horrible that someone abandoned her baby and how dare she call back," Thew said. "But she [Farrell] took the time out to talk to this girl who could have easily been judged.

"That inspired this girl to go onto college and do something with her life that she might not have had this opportunity otherwise," she said. Farrell doesn't think of her actions as above and beyond, but above and beyond prizes is what she received in honor of National Nurses Week. Nurses all across the country were celebrated during Nurses Day at Wrigley Field on

May 12, when the Cubs played the Florida Marlins. Farrell and three runner-up essay winners each received two tickets to sit behind home plate during the game. But only Farrell was invited to throw out the ceremonial first pitch.



STATE OF THE PHLOCK 2010

"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times ..." So said Charles Dickens and so it was with the year 2009 around the ParrotHead Nation. In the face of what's been called the worst economy since the Great Depression, many of our respected leaders and members found themselves out of work through no fault of their own. Imagine how difficult it must be to embrace the concept of helping others when you're desperately trying to keep your own world from tumbling down.

Nevertheless, in true Parrot Head fashion, chapters around the world made significant contributions to the welfare of the environment, their community and to their fellow man ... and they had a *BLAST* while doing so! Meeting of the Minds was an unqualified success with appearances by Little Feat and Club Trini, among others, and our visitors truly did "Party with a Purpose!" Some 200+ Parrot Heads participated in the Zonta Walk with Team ParrotHead raising approximately \$22,000, more than half of the event total. Parrot Heads also contributed to Wesley House Family Services, the KW Police Athletic League and the Florida Keys SPCA to the tune of more than \$20,000 while simultaneously donating an entire van load of toys to the Salvation Army for their annual holiday toy drive. In a truly humanitarian effort, Parrot Heads also donated some 75 pints of blood to the Community Blood Center of South Florida in what has become the local blood bank's largest blood drive of the year. Not to be outdone, the Margaritaville-sponsored Class Clown Contest raised approximately \$10,000 which was gifted to the Boys & Girls Club, the Florida Keys Children's Shelter, WomanKind and Heron-Peacock Supported Living.

In what has become the norm, the "ParrotHead Nation" continued to grow and prosper as we added a total of eleven new chapters to our ranks. What began with the Atlanta Parrot Head Club 20 years ago has grown exponentially as we ended 2009 with an all-time high of 237 chapters in the United States, Canada and Australia ... 3 different countries, 47 states, 3 Canadian provinces and one U.S. Territory. Our total membership showed another increase with almost 27,000 dedicated, fun-loving Parrot Heads amongst the ranks. Again, it's apparent that the "ParrotHead Nation" is not only alive and well, but continues to thrive.

Now, for the big news ... Even in the face of an economic downturn, Parrot Head Clubs collectively raised for and/or donated approximately \$2.8 million to charitable organizations in 2009. Equally significant, Parrot Heads carried on the tradition of volunteerism as 2009 saw chapters worldwide donate an estimated 180,000 man-hours to philanthropic and environmental activities. The upshot ... In the period 2002 – 2009, Parrot Head Clubs have collectively contributed more than \$19.2 million and approximately 2.3 million man-hours to aid our communities, our environment and our fellow man!

The PHiP commitment to education was bolstered on two fronts as we were recognized by the Jimmy Buffett's alma mater, the University of Southern Mississippi, for our continued and generous endowment of the Mary Loraine "Peets" Buffett Memorial Scholarship awarded annually by the USM Alumni Assoc. And, after years on the drawing board, the PHiP scholarship program came to fruition with the committee evaluating some 60 applicants before awarding the first scholarships to 3 worthy candidates.

In 2009, PHiP retained its National Status with both the American Cancer Society's Relay For Life campaign and the Alzheimer's Association's Memory Walk program and Parrot Heads continue to be the single largest supporter of the Zonta Club of Key West with contributions made during Meeting of the Minds. For many of our chapters, Special Olympics is a favored cause while many Clubs prepare & serve a monthly meal to their local Ronald McDonald Houses.

And, there's more to the story! These numbers, while spectacular, do not include those efforts which are not measured by dollars or man-hours and Parrot Heads never cease to amaze in their creativity:

Parrot Heads Collect Things ... canned goods, pet supplies, clothing, pop tops, old cell phones, used ink cartridges, and, of course, toys; all distributed to the appropriate agencies that get the goods to where they do the most good. OH, and let's not forget the trash ... Virtually every Club works diligently to keep our nation's beaches, lakes, and highways clean with regular trash collection sessions.

Parrot Heads Compete ... Many chapters sponsor Bowling tournaments, Volleyball tournaments, Golf tournaments and even a Cornhole tournament. Chili and gumbo cook-offs are also a favorite fundraiser for a number of Clubs.


