MINUTES FROM THE MARCH 19,2025 CHICAGO PARROTHEADS CLUB MEETING LOCATION: ANOTHER ROUND

In attendance were, Social Director -Nancy Schriener, Treasurer- Doug MacArtney, John Sheridan Recording Secretary, Communications Director- Mario Armas and Cheryl Wegner- Membership Director and Jennie Watkins - Phriendship Fund.

Absent: President Joe Klen, and Cheryl Kuropas- Charity Director

Cheryl Wegner called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM.

Cheryl announces the 50/50 was up to \$264 for St, Jude's and the Boston Marathon that our very own Christy Frisoni will be running. Christy will be talking about it later in the meeting.

Cheryl asked for a motion to accept the minutes from our last meeting and there was a motion and a second to approve the minutes as presented.

Christy, as a marathon runner, I'm so proud of you and your dedication to the children of St. Jude's. You are AWSOME!

Next was the 50/50 drawing. The winner of our 50/50 raffle was Pam Mulvaney.


